

Adrien Schopfer, PhD candidate



Adrien Schopfer is doing his PhD in forensic science at the School of criminal justice at the University of Lausanne. After a master in forensic science in Lausanne, he worked as an environmental investigator at EPFL and as a criminal intelligence analyst at the Federation of the Swiss Watch Industry. His research interests include forensic intelligence and crime analysis. Currently, Adrien works part time at the Police of Geneva as a criminal intelligence analyst. His PhD focuses on reconstructing traffic in performance-enhancing drugs (PED) using physical information recovered from the packaging of doping products and chemical information extracted from the analysis of doping substances. The research is integrated within the ENERGIA project led by INTERPOL and supported by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), which aims to disrupt the traffic in PED by collecting information about selling websites, consumer forums and physical features of seized products.
